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Khatzumoto, Glossika, Scott Young's recent experiment... etc. all of them push the mass beginner sentence craze. I suspect the real reason is that the scripts in some of these languages can sometimes be impenetrable (although not the case for Korean), and that useful natural content with script/text is often very hard to find.
