Scrum is an easy set of rules for a small team of about seven people to complete a project. Its success is due to the practice of "inspect and adapt" after each sprint (typically a 2-week iteration to complete an agreed upon list of deliverables). The focus is not "tasks completed" but "results" delivered after each sprint.

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Scrum is a lightweight framework designed to help small, close-knit teams of people develop complex products. A scrum team typically consists of around seven people who work together, in short, sustainable bursts of activity called sprints, with plenty of time for review and reflection built in
